- Select "**Ministry and Leadership**" as the program

For Financial Aid:

- Complete the FAFSA. (ORU School Code: 003985)
- You will receive a Confirmation Code after submitting your FAFSA. → Forward Confirmation Code to the Admissions Representative

Transcripts:

- Request these from all schools attended - high school and college.
- Have them send the transcripts to onlineenrollment@oru.edu

Test Scores:

- Request official ACT or SAT scores to be send directly to ORU
- ACT (institution code #3427) - <https://www.act.org/> then search "Sending your scores".
- SAT (institution code # 6552) - <http://collegeboard.org/> then search "Sending your Scores".

Admissions Committee Reviews Your COMPLETED Application

→ Acceptance - The Admissions Representative (Kate Berry) will call students when their applications are accepted. Students will also be introduced to their Success Coach (Abigail Lance).

Confirmation - When the student's financial aid is packaged, verification documents will be sent to the student for official acceptance of that aid.

Registration - Student Success Coach (Abigail Lance) will ensure students are properly enrolled in their classes. She will reach out to each student about a week before classes to make sure they are ready for DAY 1 of class.

Frequently Asked Questions

Why is ORU-Louisville@EWPC partnering with Oral Roberts University to offer this degree program?

There are a host of reasons that make ORU a fantastic educational partner. ORU provides a spiritual and historical pillar for a biblically-based worldview, spirit empowered higher education institution; ORU-Louisville provides the strength of the local church. ORU also places an institutional emphasis on retention, graduation, and placement of students, with:

- 1) US News & World Report listing ORU as Best in the West for Regional Universities and a Best Value School.
- 2) Best Value Schools ranking ORU among the top 25 schools for its Bachelor's in Theology and Christian Studies.
- 3) The Wall Street Journal ranking ORU 5th nationally out of 800 students on best student engagement!

Important notes include:

- 1) ORU's Distinctions: Princeton Review's Best in the West, Forbes calls ORU one of America's top colleges, US News and World Report considers ORU one of the best value universities.
- 2) ORU's Accreditation: ORU receives the highest accreditation through the Higher Learning Commission.
- 3) Value: the average four-year private university costs more per year than what students will pay over four years at our instructional site rate (tuition handled entirely by ORU).
- 4) Leadership Focus and Ministry Practicum: ORU-Louisville@EWPC will have training that will sharpen students' character and make them marketable post-college.
- 5) Personalization: Enrollment was almost 100k students this past year at local Colleges; at ORU-Louisville@EWPC we will have an intentionally small class size.

How do I apply to ORU-Louisville?

Currently, our ORU-Louisville specific application is live year-round. Please carefully read our instructions, which can be found on the first page of the application.

How does transferring into ORU-Louisville@EWPC work?

It is important to note that no school, whether ORU or otherwise, has to accept another institution's credits. However, ORU does a phenomenal job - with the help of admissions and enrollment specialists to accommodate students' unique situations. Most of the time credits from accredited universities will transfer. Where will ORU-Louisville@EWPC classes take place?

Classes will take place at Evangel North Church in Clarksville, Indiana just 4 miles north of Louisville, Kentucky.

What will be the cost of ORU-Louisville@EWPC?

ORU tuition and fees will be approximately 10k/year at the ORU-Louisville@EWPC instructional site, depending on credits taken. A Tulsa-based ORU student can expect to pay approximately 30k in tuition alone so ORU-Louisville@EWPC students are receiving an incredible discount for the equivalent degree upon graduation. This is usually lower than online tuition from institutions like UofL.

What degrees are offered at ORU-Louisville@EWPC?

ORU-Louisville@EWPC in collaborative agreement with Oral Roberts University offers a B.A. in Ministry and Leadership, Business Administration or Christian Counseling. These degrees are primarily designed to prepare your student for life in vocational ministry but could have application other career fields. On-site classes are primarily those within the Education Plan of B.A in Ministry and Leadership program.

However, a ORU-Louisville@EWPC College student can enroll in any one of the 19 different degree programs through ORU Online: <https://www.oru.edu/online/>

Possible Degree options include:

Ministry & Leadership, International Business & Ministry, Business Administration, Digital Communications and Christian Caregiving & Counseling.

Is this an accredited program?

Oral Roberts University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (hlcommission.org) to award baccalaureate, masters, and doctorate degrees. Students must be admitted by Oral Roberts University and in university courses to receive the benefits of a fully accredited degree.

Does ORU offer financial aid or student loans?

Yes! Because Oral Roberts University is a fully accredited institution, its partnership with ORU-Louisville@EWPC enables enrolled students to pay for their college experience using federal financial aid. To be eligible for such funding, the student must file an Application for Federal Student Aid, also known as a FAFSA, and maintain 12 credit hours each semester.

Will credits from other college's transfer or can I transfer credits from ORU to another College?

Yes! We cannot make guarantees because each school varies, but most general education courses and some major-specific courses will transfer into ORU or transfer out to other schools.

What are the minimum requirements for my student to enroll in the degree program at ORU-Louisville@EWPC?

All applications and admissions requirements are handled with ORU's admissions department. Students are required take the ACT/SAT and provide a High School Transcript.

If I attend ORU-Louisville@EWPC will I be hired by Evangel World Prayer Center once I graduate?

We make no promise you will be hired by Evangel World Prayer Center if you attend and graduate from ORU-Louisville@EWPC. What we can guarantee is if you give your best while at ORU-Louisville@EWPC, you will be set up for success no matter what their next step is.

What does Student Life look like at ORU-Louisville@EWPC?

ORU-Louisville@EWPC is a big family. We encourage students to get to know each other through various student life events, small groups, retreats and extra-curricular activities.

What does the weekly schedule look like?

At ORU-Louisville@EWPC Tuesday evenings will be set for On-Campus classes.

What are Ministry Tracks at ORU-Louisville@EWPC?

Ministry Tracks are part of Ministry training at ORU-Louisville@EWPC. This is what sets us apart from a traditional college. Ministry Training at ORU-Louisville@EWPC is focused on providing environments for students to gain real life experience in the area of ministry and leadership.

This happens in two parts: (1) Ministry & Leadership classes taught by EWPC staff and pastors, and (2) Ministry Tracks that are created to provide hands-on training that allows you to become specialized in a specific area of ministry. Tracks include: TV, Radio, Children, Youth, Outreach, etc.

Does ORU-Louisville@EWPC provide housing?

No, ORU-Louisville does not provide housing at this time. Students are responsible for secure in their own housing. If a student is in need of housing, ORU-Louisville staff will help connect him/her with incoming or current ORU-Louisville students who are looking for a roommate.
