Times Two pt13 – Faith for the Suddenly Dr. John Carmichael

[2Ki 7:1-20 NASB95] 1 Then Elisha said, "Listen to the word of the LORD; thus says the LORD, 'Tomorrow about this time a measure of fine flour will be [sold] for a shekel, and two measures of barley for a shekel, in the gate of Samaria." 2 The royal officer on whose hand the king was leaning answered the man of God and said, "Behold, if the LORD should make windows in heaven, could this thing be?" Then he said, "Behold, you will see it with your own eyes, but you will not eat of it." 3 Now there were four leprous men at the entrance of the gate: and they said to one another, "Why do we sit here until we die? 4 "If we say, 'We will enter the city,' then the famine is in the city and we will die there; and if we sit here, we die also. Now therefore come, and let us go over to the camp of the Arameans. If they spare us, we will live; and if they kill us, we will but die." 5 They arose at twilight to go to the camp of the Arameans; when they came to the outskirts of the camp of the Arameans, behold, there was no one there. 6 For the Lord had caused the army of the Arameans to hear a sound of chariots and a sound of horses, [even] the sound of a great army, so that they said to one another, "Behold, the king of Israel has hired against us the kings of the Hittites and the kings of the Egyptians, to come upon us." 7 Therefore they arose and fled in the twilight, and left their tents and their horses and their donkeys, [even] the camp just as it was, and fled for their life. 8 When these lepers came to the outskirts of the camp, they entered one tent and ate and drank, and carried from there silver and gold and clothes, and went and hid [them;] and they returned and entered another tent and carried from there [also,] and went and hid [them.] 9 Then they said to one another, "We are not doing right. This day is a day of good news, but we are keeping silent; if we wait until morning light, punishment will overtake us. Now therefore come, let us go and tell the king's household." 10 So they came and called to the gatekeepers of the city, and they told them, saying, "We came to the camp of the Arameans, and behold, there was no one there, nor the voice of man, only the horses tied and the donkeys tied, and the tents just as they were." 11 The gatekeepers called and told [it] within the king's household. 12 Then the king arose in the night and said to his servants, "I will now tell you what the Arameans have done to us. They know that we are hungry; therefore they have gone from the camp to hide themselves in the field, saying, 'When they come out of the city, we will capture them alive and get into the city." 13 One of his servants said. "Please. let some [men] take five of the horses which remain, which are left in the city. Behold, they [will be in any case] like all the multitude of Israel who are left in it: behold, they [will be in any case] like all the multitude of Israel who have already perished, so let us send and see." 14 They took therefore two chariots with horses, and the king sent after the army of the Arameans, saying, "Go and see." 15 They went after them to the Jordan, and behold, all the way was full of clothes and equipment which the Arameans had thrown away in their haste. Then the messengers returned and told the king. 16 So the people went out and plundered the camp of the Arameans. Then a measure of fine flour [was sold] for a shekel and two measures of barley for a shekel, according to the word of the LORD. 17 Now the king appointed the royal officer on whose hand he leaned to have charge of the gate; but the people trampled on him at the gate, and he died just as the man of God had said, who spoke when the king came down to him. 18 It happened just as the man of God had spoken to the king, saying, "Two measures of barley for a shekel and a measure of fine flour for a shekel, will be [sold] tomorrow about this time at the gate of Samaria." 19 Then the royal officer answered the man of God and said, "Now behold, if the LORD should make windows in heaven, could such a thing be?" And he said, "Behold, you will see it with your own eyes, but you will not eat of it." 20 And so it happened to him, for the people trampled on him at the gate and he died.

Times Two pt13 – Faith for the Suddenly Dr. John Carmichael

- Progressive miracles are supernatural. We have been correctly taught to believe that many miracles happen progressively. However, we must never lose touch with the fact that God can and does often move suddenly.
- In this story, God, in one day, totally changes the environment of the people.
- Never turn loose of the faith for sudden miracles.

What do we learn about how God can move suddenly from this story?

There are four elements of God moving suddenly in this story.

- I. Faith for the suddenly begins when you hear the Word.
 - a. V. 1 Elisha had a good word from God.
 - b. [2Ki 6:33 NASB95] 33 While he was still talking with them, behold, the messenger came down to him and he said, "Behold, this evil is from the LORD; why should I wait for the LORD any longer?"
 - c. Receive what God says.
 - d. [Psa 119:130 NASB95] 130 The unfolding of Your words gives light; It gives understanding to the simple.
 - e. Faith begins when the Will of God (Word of God) is known.

II. Faith for the suddenly requires you to believe the Word.

- a. V. 2 The official does not believe the Word.
 - i. He doubted
 - 1. The power of God.
 - 2. The creativity of God.
 - 3. The messenger of God.
 - ii. His doubt separated him from the blessing.
- b. The Word must be mixed with faith in order to have any affect. [Heb 4:2 NASB95] 2 For indeed we have had good news preached to us, just as they also; but the word they heard did not profit them, because it was not united by faith in those who heard.
- c. [Jas 1:5-8 NASB95] 5 But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him. 6 But he must ask in faith without any doubting, for the one who doubts is like the surf of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind. 7 For that man ought not to expect that he will receive anything from the Lord, 8 [being] a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.
- d. Unbelief can cause you not be able to experience the blessing.

III. Faith for the suddenly should cause you to spread the Word.

- a. V. 3-5 & 8-9 The lepers told others about the blessing.
- b. God expects us to spread the Word about the miracles in our lives.

IV. Faith for the suddenly causes you to experience the fulfillment of the Word.

- a. V. 16-20 God did everything Elisha said He would do.
- b. The miracle of supply.
- c. The demise of the soldier.
- God will do miracles suddenly in our lives as we hear His Word, believe His Word, and share His Word so we can experience the fulfillment of His Word.
